
- Mission: Make TVS a safe, clean and enjoyable neighborhood for all
- Obtained the 15% stormwater tax credit for all homeowners
- Paid 2018 retention pond property taxes with closing credit from last owner
- Verified we will not be taxed on ponds in future with county collector
- Issued 16 closing letters in 2019 for new homebuyers, refinance and HELOC applications
- Partnered with Timberline North to hold neighborhood garage sale in May
- Partnered with city to hold neighborhood clean-up event on 9/21
- Repaired 7 nonfunctional post lamps to improve neighborhood lighting / safety
- · Updated covenants on post lamps, parking, garbage and cable dish placement
- Conducted and completed vote on approving updates

- Placed No Trespassing signs on retention pond easements (Insurance requirement)
- Updated Timberline Valley South Registered Agent
- Obtained cost estimates:
 - Muskrat trapping estimate from Anything Wild (\$1700)
 - Algae control estimate from Marine Biochemists (\$3900)
 - Goose egg pick estimate through DNR (\$1200)
 - Repair of severe erosion at Lake outlet #5 (by 602 Erin Dr and 3412 Clayton) (\$12,980)
- We did not approve any expenditures, focus was to understand costs, build reserve
- Volunteers culled goose nests in subdivision by 55 eggs & 350 eggs over past 3 years
- Volunteer attempted to catch muskrats
- Individuals did voluntary spot treatments for algae


- Clarified pond management responsibilities with Champaign Public Works Director
- Subdivision is responsible for maintenance costs associated with
 - Erosion control, silting and 2 exposed drains
 - Drain #1: Lake outlet #5 (by 602 Erin Dr and 3412 Clayton)
 - Drain #2 Lake outfall #9 (by 719 Erin Dr)
- City will cover costs associated with maintenance of all underground storm pipes
- Obtained Illinois Native Plant guidelines on alternatives for erosion control

- Achieved 100% assessment participation in 2019
- Worked with city and landlord to have Tang Dynasty Truck removed
- Volunteers removed paddleboat by Lake outlet #5 (recommended we keep clear by city)
- Purchased 9 grass carp from annual DNR sale to assist with weed control in ponds
- Obtained Free Bass and Bluegill from DNR with grass carp
- Reported ordinance violations for city review to encourage neighborhood maintenance
 - Parking
 - Grass cutting
 - Downed trees
 - Roof and siding repair

COVENANT AMENDMENT VOTING RESULTS (24 PROXY VOTES EXERCISED)




GOALS FOR 2020

- Develop a plan for overgrowth / debris clean up on 157 pond
- Partner with city and respective lot owners to repair severe erosion
- Obtain access so all stormwater drains can be scoped (fence & dock issue)
- Mark storm drains / encourage clearing of obstructions (Leaves, grass ...)
- Investigate options for low cost, environmentally friendly algae control
 - Diffusion aeration
 - Grass carp and catfish
 - Native noninvasive Illinois plants
- Monitor & control muskrat population to mitigate shore erosion

- Reserve depleted resolving ownership dispute in 2018
- Reserve replenished in 2019 with minimized spending
- Concern about erosion around exit drain 100B, entrance to 100A
- Getting budget estimates for erosion resolution
- Meeting scheduled with Champaign Public Works Director
- Goal is to lock down our responsibility regarding pipe maintenance
- This will help us set a better budget target for our reserve fund


OLD BUSINESS

- Have items out by 6:00 am
- Keep > 5 ft away from trees, mailboxes, light poles, hydrants...
- Branches <2" in diameter; < 3.5' long; bundles <18" diameter
- Link available on our web page for map, schedule & details
- Bradley Bridge project has pushed out to end of year
- Watch Nextdoor and Gazette for latest news

BRADLEY BRIDGE PROJECT

- Crestwood will remain closed until project completion
- Concern that new walk will bring more foot & bike traffic, noise & litter
- Signs requested to encourage courtesy on Bradley commons walkway
- IDOT reviewed how new walk connects with concerned homeowners
- Better lighting on Bradley for bike paths, road & walkways
- Disappointment expressed that railing is not like one on Windsor Rd
- Windsor railing required because of steep slope per city and IDOT

NUISANCE ISSUES REPORTED TO HOA


Most violate ordinances, the remainder will need a covenant update

- I. Grass / weeds not being cut per city ordinance (>8" is violation)
- 2. Trailers, commercial vehicle storage for extended periods
- 3. Excessive weeds >8" between fences that form alleyways
- 4. Pet owners not cleaning up after pets
- 5. Littering, excessive noise foot / bike traffic along Bradley / Ed Hoffman
- 6. Home with hole in roof, fallen tree, weeds, litter, abandoned paddleboat
- 7. Landscape bags, debris and garbage stored in front of homes

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH

- Crime in Timberline South has diminished but is still present
- Unlocked cars targeted here and in surrounding subdivisions
- Simple deterrents
 - Keep your car doors locked & garage doors closed if you're not watching
 - Keep your post lamp functional, a well lit home is a less attractive target
 - A side benefit, the post lamps draw insects away from your home
- Consider RING or Nest cameras for additional security

RETENTION POND MAINTENANCE







- 100B erosion bad in several areas. Most critical is at the exit drain and the Erin Utility easement.
- About 2 feet of erosion at 100B exit drain (Shown left); paddleboat has been removed.
- The HOA developed a recommendation for RIP/RAP (RR3). Need to socialize with lake lot owners for feedback
- 100A north shoreline in poor shape at inlet pipe.
- Inlets from I57, Boulder Ridge and Sawgrass functioning well but erosion needs to be documented. There are reports of backup, flow and washout of the north shoreline.
